

NCCSAH May 2002: REVISITING SPLENDID SURVIVORS

The NCCSAH spring meeting will be held Saturday, May 18th in San Francisco. The day-long event will be co-sponsored by San Francisco's Architectural Heritage. The theme of the day is *Revisiting Splendid Survivors*, the 1977-79 effort to survey downtown San Francisco. A morning panel discussion will be followed by lunch, a walk up Market Street and a late afternoon reception. Return your registration form today!!! Space is limited!!



In 1979, after a two-year effort, involving many, many, many dedicated individuals, the Foundation for San Francisco's Architectural Heritage (now San Francisco's Architectural Heritage), in collaboration with author and architectural historian Michael Corbett and the firm Charles Hall Page & Associates (now Page & Turnbull), published Splendid Survivors: San Francisco's Downtown Architectural Heritage.

The book served many purposes, but perhaps its most important role was the dissemination of information about the architecture of San Francisco's commercial downtown; not only to preservationists. architects, and historians, but to the general public. Splendid Survivors was a marketing tool for old buildings. At a time when many cities, including San Francisco, were tearing down buildings, "redeveloping," pursuing freeway expansion, and wooing corporate giants to build new skyscrapers, the book assisted Heritage and other groups in lobbying decision makers regarding urban design issues and historic buildings in San Francisco.

Prop. 40 Passes

Proposition 40 will make \$267 million available for appropriation by the legislature and grants for the acquisition, restoration, preservation, and interpretation of buildings, structures, sites, places and artifacts that preserve and demonstrate California's historical and cultural resources.

Eligible projects include, but are not limited to, those which preserve and demonstrate the following:

Culturally significant aspects of life during various periods of California history including architecture, economic activities, art, recreation, and transportation.

Unique identifiable ethnic and other communities that have added significant elements to California's culture.

California industrial, commercial, and military history including the industries, technologies, and commercial activities that have characterized California's economic expansion and California's contribution to national defense.

Important paleontologic, oceanographic, and geologic sites and specimens.

It is anticipated that Prop. 40 will greatly enhance the available funding for historic preservation projects throughout the state. Thanks to everyone who helped make Prop. 40 a reality.
